#### TUTA's Fulton Street Sessions

TUTA bills this ensemble-devised creation—the company's first original work—as a "cabaret." But it's not the kind of piece you'll find at Davenport's. A collection of sketches and songs ranging from Lionel Richie to Shakira to "Nearer, My God, to Thee," *Fulton Street Sessions* is as adventurous and uneven as that assortment sounds.

Designers Brandon Wardell and Keith Parham turn the Chicago Dramatists stage into a sharply defined, starkly lit white box. Christopher Kriz's sound design, with prominent microphones and speakers that seem intentionally set to hum over silence, reinforces the sense that we're observing a tightly controlled environment. Indeed, as the show's five actors pinball among the set's many doors, they begin to look like laboratory specimens; in many of the sketches, it feels as though we're observing from behind a two-way mirror.

Program notes indicate Sessions was loosely inspired by last February's massive blizzard and the media frenzy that surrounded it—an early number has Jaimelyn Gray rattling off a long list of hoary snow-related neologisms ("Snowpocalypse! Snow-M-G! Snowstradamus!"). The genesis of other interludes is less clear, though a running theme of feeling trapped can be traced back to that citywide flash-freeze. While some scenes
